Regional and relocating students

If you're studying with UniSA Online, you might be eligible for financial assistance through a range of scholarships and grants.

International student scholarships

If you're an international student, we can help support your studies and time at UniSA. Examples:

Vice Chancellor's International Excellence Scholarship

Recipients receive a 50% reduction in their student contributions (tuition fees) for the duration of their degree, or for up to four years of full-time study.

International Merit Scholarship

Recipients receive a 15% reduction in their student contributions (tuition fees) for the duration of their chosen degree.

As a refugee student, we can help to reduce your costs of studying through a range of cash grants. Examples:
