Develop the knowledge, clinical skills and attitudes needed for professional practice in a range of settings. Benefit from a strong focus on theory and practical experience, including access to our unique clinician-led hospital and health service on campus, which includes authentic hospital wards, clinical units and community areas. Be prepared to meet healthcare delivery requirements for the 21st century and respond to Australian and international healthcare priorities and trends. Focus on six integrated themes of nursing practice, including safety and quality, cultural safety, evidence-based practice, professional communication, consumers as partners in care, and teamwork. You'll also learn about cultural competence, mental health, primary healthcare and healthy ageing. Embark on 1,000 hours of nursing placements from your first year of study. Graduate with the academic requirements needed for registration as a Registered Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA).

To meet entry requirements, applicants must consider the professional registration requirements, including the English Language Skills standard and complete a declaration stating how they will demonstrate their English language competency, as determined by the NMBA.

Prepare for a highly rewarding career in maternity care and women's health as a Registered Midwife. Develop the knowledge and practical skills to support women through pregnancy, labour, birth and postnatal care. Benefit from a strong focus on theory and hands-on experience, including industry placements to prepare you for clinical practice. As an international profession with different birthing preferences all over the world, you'll learn how political, socio-cultural, economic and technological factors influence midwifery practice. Learn in our clinician-led, authentic simulated hospital and health service on campus, which incorporates a birthing suite, special care nursery and postnatal area, as well as birthing manikins. Complete comprehensive placement hours and be actively involved in 30 births during your studies, along with the pre and post-birth care of at least 100 women. You'll also follow 15 women through their entire pregnancy, labour, birth and postnatal journeys. Graduate with the academic requirements needed for registration as a midwife with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA).

Focus on four major study areas, including social work theory, social work practice, social policy and social research. Develop knowledge of various social work practices and their application with individuals, families, communities, groups and organisations. Learn how to identify the social policies that impact people's lives and the strategic ways to implement change. Interpret, evaluate and conduct relevant social analysis exploring current real-world challenges. Focus your degree by choosing to incorporate a minor in Children, Families and Society. Access our custom-built social work and human services studio to practise your skills through stimulated scenarios. Gain valuable professional experience through industry placements in your final years of study. Attend classes on campus with the possibility to study some courses online. Graduate with a degree recognised by the Australian Association of Social Workers and be eligible for full membership.

Students will be required to undertake Criminal History Checks through the Department of Human Services (DHS), a SAPOL National Police Record Check and complete a one-day Safe Environments for Children and Young People course prior to being accepted for work placements. To be eligible for placement, providers may also require students to be screened and provide evidence of their vaccination status, hold a driver's licence, and/or meet additional requirements.

Some degrees also have prerequisites and other eligibility criteria for entry that you'll still have to meet. Year 12 subjects need to be 20-credit Stage 2 Tertiary Admission Subjects (TAS). Students also need to achieve a minimum ATAR of 50.



YOUR PATHWAYS

We have a range of alternative pathways for regional students to gain entry into university.

UniSA COLLEGE

UniSA College offers a range of pathway programs to help you gain alternative entry into your preferred UniSA or UniSA Online degree.

These programs will prepare you for university study by building your academic skills, prerequisite knowledge and confidence to thrive in your chosen degree. You'll experience life as a UniSA student, learn from UniSA staff and have access to a full range of support services. Once you've successfully completed your program, you'll be able to transfer into one of UniSA or UniSA Online's bachelor degrees using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA).

SPECIAL TERTIARY ADMISSIONS TEST

If you don't have a competitive result from Year 12, TAFE/VET or previous university study, you may qualify for special entry into your preferred UniSA degree by choosing to sit the STAT – a two-hour test made up of 70 multiple choice questions designed to measure your aptitude for tertiary study. Your results will be used to create a ranking that you can then use to compete for entry with other special entry applicants. To be eligible, you must be aged over 18 years by 1 February (or 1 July for midyear entry) in the year you wish to commence your study.

TAFE/VET GRADUATES

A completed certificate IV, diploma or advanced diploma from TAFE or another registered training organisation may be all you need to apply for a UniSA degree. If your completed qualification meets the UniSA TAFE/VET Guaranteed Entry score, you have met the prerequisites and any specific entry requirements, and you have listed the degree as your first preference, you're guaranteed an offer. If you're successful in securing a place in a relevant UniSA degree, you may also be eligible to receive credit for your previous study, typically reducing the time it takes to complete the program. We also set TAFE/VET cut-offs and you could be considered for entry with a lower qualification.

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

You'll apply through SATAC for entry into the UniSA Foundation Studies and Diploma programs. For Undergraduate Certificates in University Studies, you'll apply directly through UniSA after you have successfully completed the UniSA Foundation Studies program. This is also open to students who have partially completed a bachelor's degree and are looking to explore other areas of interest. Applications for the Aboriginal Pathway program are made directly through UniSA College.

Top tip:

If applying through SATAC, make sure you know the key dates listed on their website. Once you've submitted your application, remember to pay your SATAC application fee, otherwise you won't receive an offer. Applications are made April–July for midyear entry and typically August–January for commencement in the following year. Successful applicants will be notified by email, so check your inbox regularly!

UniSA FOUNDATION STUDIES

UniSA Foundation Studies is a great way to start university and will help you thrive with future studies. You'll explore core courses to develop your critical writing, communication, research and study skills – including how to write academic assignments, referencing and effective time management. As a regional student, you'll study through a combination of online and on-campus learning.

After successfully completing this six-month program, you can progress into an Undergraduate Certificate in University Studies or a Diploma. From there, you can apply for many UniSA or UniSA Online degrees using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA).

There are no formal entry requirements or tuition fees. Applications are made directly through SATAC.

UNDERGRADUATE CERTIFICATES IN UNIVERSITY STUDIES

Through an Undergraduate Certificate in University Studies, you'll explore courses aligned to your area of interest, with specialisations in Business, Creative Studies, Education Studies, Health, Social Sciences and STEM. As a regional student, you'll study through a combination of online and on-campus learning.

Once you've successfully completed your Undergraduate Certificate, you'll graduate with a standalone qualification and can use your Grade Point Average (GPA) to apply for direct entry into more than 90 UniSA or UniSA Online degrees.

This pathway option is for current UniSA students only, so it's ideal if you've completed UniSA Foundation Studies or have partially completed another degree and you're interested in exploring another area of study. Applications are submitted directly through UniSA College and entry criteria apply.

DIPLOMAS

UniSA College Diplomas provide a pathway into more than 100 UniSA and UniSA Online degrees.

You'll kickstart your career by studying a combination of courses that will develop your academic skills, along with up to two first-year courses from a related bachelor's degree. This will give you a real insight into your preferred degree and up to two study credits. As a regional student, you'll learn through a mix of online and on-campus learning.

Diplomas are offered across key areas in Business, Creative Studies, Education Studies, Health, Social Sciences and STEM. Applications are through SATAC and entry criteria apply.

ABORIGINAL PATHWAY

Our 18-month Aboriginal Pathway program supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students start their journey at university.

You'll develop academic, literacy, digital and numerical skills, along with enhanced knowledge in areas such as Aboriginal culture and wellbeing, and the community and environment. You'll get all the support you need along the way, including local tutoring and one-on-one support from teaching staff.

The program prepares you to thrive at university, and upon completion, you can apply for your preferred UniSA or UniSA Online degree using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA).

The program is open to all people who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and is offered in Mount Gambier, Ceduna, Port Lincoln and Whyalla.

There are no formal entry requirements or tuition fees. Applications are made directly through UniSA College and you may also be eligible for travel and accommodation support.

STUDY SUPPORT

We want you to achieve your best, so we offer a variety of study support services. You can access online learning resources, talk with a learning adviser, connect with a mentor, and receive free after-hours tutoring online. Our Study Help PALS are also available to provide friendly, informal study support at dedicated sessions on campus. They're current UniSA students who can help you with assignment writing, referencing and building your overall study skills.

YOUR TIMETABLE

If you decide to study locally in Mount Gambier, you can generally organise to fit all of your on-campus classes into 1-2 days. This gives you flexibility to work part-time or travel home if you live in surrounding areas.

Your study schedule will be divided into contact hours – the time you spend in lectures and tutorials – and independent study, including your personal research and assignment work.

Study hours depend on the program you choose and the amount of additional work you put in. A full-time study load is typically around 40 hours per week (12-16 hours class contact, 14-28 hours independent study). You'll most likely complete four subjects per study period, so eight subjects in total for the year. This will be a mixture of core courses and a range of electives or subjects that align to your stream, major/minor or specialisation.




myUniSA portal
