

THE APPLICATION PROCESS

You'll apply through SATAC for entry into the UniSA Foundation Studies and Diploma programs. For Undergraduate Certificates in University Studies, you'll apply directly through UniSA after you have successfully completed the UniSA Foundation Studies program. This is also open to current students who have partially completed a bachelor's degree and are looking to explore other areas of interest. Applications for the Aboriginal Pathway program are made directly through UniSA College.

Top tip:

If applying through SATAC, make sure you know the key dates listed on their website. Once you've submitted your application, remember to pay your SATAC application fee, otherwise you won't receive an offer. Applications are made April—July for midyear entry and typically August—January for commencement in the following year. Successful applicants will be notified by email, so check your inbox regularly!

UniSA Foundation Studies

UniSA Foundation Studies is a great start to university, setting you up for success for further studies in the discipline you're interested in.

Duration: 6 months full-time

Cost: No tuition fee, compulsory student amenities fee applies

Location: Adelaide (City West Campus), Mount Gambier or Whyalla

Study mode: On-campus with online study options available

Study core courses to develop your critical writing, communication, research, and study skills — including how to write academic assignments, how to reference and effective time management. These skills and experiences will give you the right launchpad to navigate your future at university.

After successfully completing this six-month program, you can progress into an Undergraduate Certificate in University Studies with a chosen specialisation in Business, Creative Studies, Education Studies, Health, Social Sciences or STEM. You can also choose to progress from UniSA Foundation Studies to a Diploma with many specialisations on offer. From here, you can then competitively apply for many UniSA or UniSA Online degrees using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA).

REGIONAL STUDY

UniSA Foundation Studies is also offered at our regional campuses and study centres in Mount Gambier and Whyalla. You can enrol in a mix of on-campus and online courses.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

There are no formal entry requirements for this program, including ATAR or grades. However, you must:

- Be an Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen, or the holder of an Australian permanent visa; and
- Not have completed a TAFE/VET award at Certificate IV or higher.

In addition, you must be at least 18 years of age to commence your studies unless you've completed your SACE or a Certificate III.

A personal pathway to pharmacy

Imagine a career crisscrossing the country, working in more than 25 rural and regional pharmacies on postings from Mount Isa in Queensland down to Nubeena, Tasmania.

This is the life of UniSA graduate, Sean Richardson. The journey to where he is now hasn't been straightforward, but he has followed his own path to success.

Leaving school at 16, Sean headed straight into a labouring career, spending years on private residential developments and major construction civil sites around Adelaide. The tradesperson life was great, until a workplace accident put future career realities into perspective.

Initially, university didn't seem like a fitting choice, Sean questioned whether the investment of a degree was really for him. But it was a chance conversation that introduced the idea of studying Foundation Studies through UniSA College that changed everything.

- An interstate or overseas qualification considered by the University as a SACE equivalent; or
- A recognised Certificate III or Certificate IV from TAFE or a registered training organisation.

In addition, applicants must:

- · Be an Australian citizen, a New Zealand citizen or the holder of an Australian permanent visa: and
- Meet the relevant citizenship and residency requirements for a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Applicants who have completed a TAFE/VET award at a diploma level or above, or who have studied at the higher education level for more than two years, are not eligible for admission into UniSA College diplomas

You'll develop academic, literacy, digital and numerical skills, along with enhancing knowledge in areas such as Aboriginal culture and wellbeing, and the community and environment. You'll get all the support you need along the way, including local tutoring and one-on-one support from teaching staff.

The program prepares you to thrive at university and upon completion, you can apply for your preferred UniSA or UniSA Online degree using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA).

The program is open to all people who identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander and is offered across both metro and regional locations.

STRONG LEARNING FOUNDATIONS

At UniSA College, we prepare you to study successfully at university. You'll complete core courses that develop the writing, communication, numeracy, research and study skills that you need at the tertiary level. You'll also start exploring courses in the areas that interest you most, introducing you to what a bachelor's degree will be like. Your learning will be supported by highly experienced and supportive staff, who are there to support you every step of the way.

FLEXIBLE STUDY OPTIONS

We know that not all students can study full-time, so there are flexible study options available. You can choose between full-time or part-time study, with most courses offering online study options. Your study schedule will be divided into contact hours — the time you spend on lectures and tutorials — and independent study, including your personal research and assignment work. YEAR 12 RESULTS

Did you know that your Selection Rank (ATAR inclusive of adjustment factors) and Year 12 subject grades are still valid after you finish high school? You can competitively apply for your preferred UniSA degree using your Year 12 results up until you've completed two-years of tertiary study. This is a great option if you want to transfer to a different degree, or you took a gap year and are now ready to start your university studies.

UniSA Guaranteed Entry - Year 12

If you're thinking about competitively applying to university using your Year 12 results (either Selection Rank or Year 12 subject grades), don't forget about UniSA Guaranteed Entry. Make us your first preference and if you achieve the set score or grades, you'll automatically receive an offer through SATAC based on your best result. Some criteria apply. See page 29.

TAFE/VET QUALIFICATIONS

A completed Certificate IV, Diploma or Advanced Diploma from TAFE or another registered training organisation may be all you need to apply for a UniSA degree. Explore the degrees that interest you most and see what VET qualification is needed for entry.

UniSA Guaranteed Entry - TAFE/VET

Through UniSA Guaranteed Entry, your TAFE/VET qualifications can be used to secure your future place in your preferred degree. By making UniSA your first preference and successfully completing the set TAFE/VET qualification, you'll automatically receive an offer through SATAC. Some criteria apply. See page 29.

Study credit

If you're successful in securing a place into a UniSA degree through your TAFE/VET qualification, you may also be eligible to receive credit for your previous study. This also typically reduces the time it takes to complete the program. Through our online 'Credit Assessor', you can see an instant snapshot of how your qualifications may count towards your future studies.

SPECIAL TERTIARY ADMISSIONS TEST

If you don't have a competitive result from your Year 12, TAFE/VET or previous university study, you may qualify for entry into your preferred UniSA degree by choosing to sit the Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT) — 70 multiple choice questions designed to assess your aptitude for tertiary study. Your results will be used to create a ranking that you can then use to compete for entry with other special entry applicants. To be eligible, you must be aged over 18 years by 1 February (or 1 July for midyear entry) in the year you wish to commence your study.



You can study a SAIBT Diploma and gain direct entry into the second year of more than 80 UniSA degrees (subject to academic results). SAIBT offer a Diploma in Arts, Diploma in Business, Diploma in Engineering, Diploma in Health Sciences and a Diploma in Information Technology.

As a SAIBT student, you'll have access to UniSA teachers and facilities. You'll also study some UniSA courses, giving you an introduction into university learning, and will be supported through small class sizes and personalised teaching.

OPEN UNIVERSITIES AUSTRALIA

If you've studied at least four courses of an Open Universities Australia (OUA) degree, then you can use your Grade Point Average (GPA) to competitively apply for entry into a UniSA degree. There's more than 2,000 subjects and 800 degrees to choose from, across areas like business, engineering, health, law, psychology and teaching.

TERTIARY TRANSFER

If your Year 12 results were lower than expected, you have the option of starting a different degree then using your competitive Grade Point Average (GPA) to transfer into your first preference. You can do this after completing four courses of an undergraduate degree, which is typically one full-time study period (semester) at UniSA or another recognised higher education institution. Students are also able to transfer into different degrees if they change their mind, using your competitive GPA and after completing a minimum of four courses.

What your studies might look like

Starting university study is a big deal and there's lots of information to take in.

Whether you've recently finished high school or are coming back to study after some time away, understanding what your studies will look like can help you ease into university life.

Here are some things that can be different depending on what UniSA degree you choose:

- · Degree length years it will take to complete.
- · Home campus we have four metro and two regional campuses.
- Study mode how your degree is delivered (on-campus, online, or a combination of both).
- · Flexibility option to study online or part-time.
- Courses create your own experience through subject, elective and stream selections.

If you're studying full-time, you can typically expect to complete four subjects per study period, so eight subjects in total for the year. This will be a mixture of core courses and a range of electives or subjects that align to your stream, major/minor or specialisation. Lectures are mostly delivered online, but you'll come on campus for tutorials, workshops and other practical learning.

Paying for your studies

If you're an Australian citizen, your place as a student at UniSA is Commonwealth supported.

This means you're only charged a portion of the cost of your studies and the Australian Government contributes the rest. If eligible, you can defer your contribution through a HECS-HELP loan and repay it later through the taxation system. Your contribution will depend on what you study.

FEES

All UniSA domestic undergraduate students are in Commonwealth-supported places.

Students pay a contribution of their fees depending on their program and the associated contribution band (see table below). Student contributions also depend on the unit value courses. As per the Australian Government guidelines, the student contribution amounts for 2023 are:

CHECK AND CONFIRM

If you're a Year 12 student, your results are finalised in mid-December. Check to see if you're eligible for adjustment factors and confirm your Selection Rank (ATAR inclusive of adjustment factors) by visiting SATAC's self-service portal. Then, give our Future Students Enquiries team a call to talk through your study options.

You could be eligible for UniSA's Guaranteed Entry into your preferred degree by using either your Year 12 subject grades or by achieving the guaranteed Selection Rank score.

Did you know that you could also gain entry to UniSA by using your TAFE/VET qualification? We offer both minimum and guaranteed TAFE/VET options.

It's also important to confirm your preferences by the change of preference deadline to be considered for an offer.
