

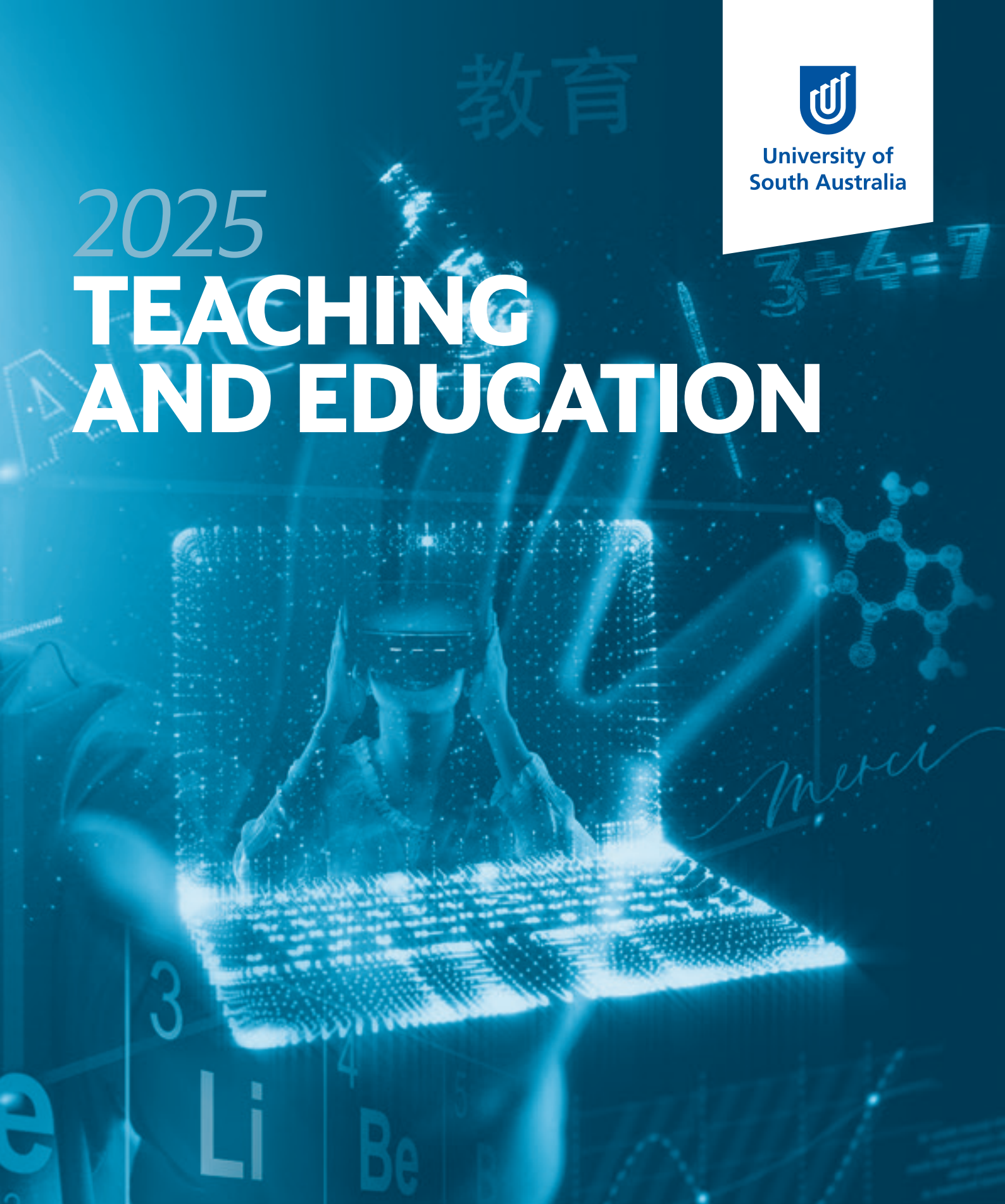

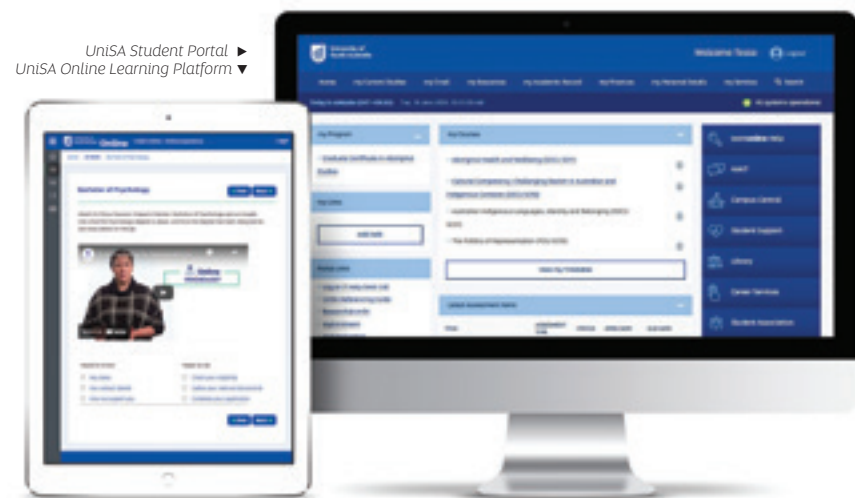

PROFESSIONAL REQUIREMENTS

NON-ACADEMIC ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

In accordance with national teacher education program standards, applicants must fulfil non-academic entry requirements before their application is considered complete. If you're applying for the Bachelor of Early Childhood Education (Honours), Bachelor of Primary Education (Honours), Bachelor of Secondary Education (Honours) or Master of Teaching you'll be required to submit a 400–600 word (maximum) Teaching Capabilities Statement, which speaks to your understanding of being a teacher.

PLACEMENT REQUIREMENTS

In the lead-up to each professional experience placement, you need to ensure that a number of important prerequisites and requirements are completed or satisfied, including:

- A Department of Human Services (DHS) Working With Children Check;
- Mandatory Child-Safe Environments Training; and
- Meeting required standards in the national Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education (LANTITE) – to be completed during your studies prior to your final placement (except if you're studying Bachelor of Early Childhood (B-5 years).

To be eligible for placement, providers may require students to be screened and provide evidence of their vaccination status.

The first of its kind in South Australia, this degree will set you up for a rewarding career as an early childhood teacher in preschool/kindergarten, childcare and community services settings. You'll gain the skills and knowledge to support the learning and development of children from birth to five years of age from diverse cultures and backgrounds. You'll also be able to access the latest research about brain development, neurodiversity, and the importance of learning through play. The degree is largely practical-based, and centres on the principles and concepts relating to early childhood development and learning, as well as curriculum planning for children up to the age of five. Get real early childhood education experience with up to 80 days of field-based placements starting in your first six months of study. Graduate ready to make a difference in the lives of children at a critical time that sets the foundations for their future learning.

Study this degree to teach children from birth to eight years of age Choose a Learning Area from Arts, English, Languages, Mathematics/ Science or Religious Education (Catholic Studies).*

Choose an elective, focusing on teaching children with disabilities, rural and regional education, brain development, relationships and health, arts in early childhood curriculum, pedagogies for learning languages, or Islam and global politics.

This degree prepares you to thrive as a contemporary teacher in three settings – junior primary, preschool and childcare. Gain a competitive advantage by studying industry-relevant coursework, engaging in highly practical learning and developing applied research. You'll focus on the learning and development of children from birth to eight years of age, exploring best education practices, curriculum planning, professional experience and leadership. You'll complete three courses in a primary specialism (Learning Area) of your choice to meet national teacher registration requirements. Learning Areas include Arts, English, Languages (French, Italian, Japanese), Mathematics/Science, or Religious Education (Catholic Studies). Get real classroom experience with 110 days of field-based placements starting in your first six months of study. APPLYING WITH YEAR 12 RESULTS

Applicants are required to have successfully completed the South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) with:

- A competitive Selection Rank (ATAR inclusive of adjustment factors);
- Fulfilment of the degree's prerequisite requirements (where applicable).

Applicants may also be eligible to compete for entry if they have completed the degree's prerequisite requirements and one of the following:

- An interstate or overseas qualification considered by the University as equivalent to SACE; or
- The International Baccalaureate Diploma with a minimum score of 24 points.

ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Australian high school students applying for university study may be eligible for adjustment factors. These are based on set equity factors and/or subject choices (see below). SATAC will combine them with your ATAR to improve your Selection Rank for entry.

- The Universities Equity Scheme – provides additional points for students coming from specified schools, as well as individuals experiencing socio-economic disadvantage.
- The Universities Language, Literacy and Mathematics Adjustment Scheme – provides additional points for students who successfully complete a language other than English, or specified English and Mathematics subjects.

GUARANTEED ENTRY

There are a few ways to guarantee your place at UniSA:


Year 12 Grades Guaranteed Entry – UniSA offers guaranteed entry based on your three best Year 12 subject grades for most degrees. If you achieve the selection grades and you put us as your first preference, that's it, you're automatically in.

Subjects need to be 20-credit Stage 2 Tertiary Admission Subjects (TAS). Students also need to achieve a minimum ATAR of 50.

Selection Rank Guaranteed Entry – UniSA has set guaranteed entry scores for most of our degrees. This means, that if you achieve that set Selection Rank and you put us as your first preference, you're in. There's nothing more you have to do.

Some degrees also have prerequisites and other eligibility criteria for entry that you'll still have to meet. Application timelines and fees also apply.

TAFE/VET Guaranteed Entry – UniSA offers guaranteed entry based on successfully completed VET qualifications. If your completed VET award meets the set VET Guaranteed Entry, you have met any prerequisites and specific entry requirements, and you have listed the degree as your first preference, you're guaranteed an offer.
