ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

A completed three-year Bachelor degree or equivalent in any discipline from a recognised higher education institution.

- OR a completed Certificate IV or Diploma VET/TAFE qualification in a related discipline and a minimum of one year full-time professional (and/or formal voluntary) experience in the disability, rehabilitation or related human services fields or part-time equivalent.
- OR a minimum of three years' full-time Human Services sector, ageing and disability or related services experience (including formal voluntary) or part-time equivalent within the past 15 years.

Applicants are asked to also provide a brief curriculum vitae.
